CALL FOR ENTRIES

Now in its third year, the IBP Regional Journalism Awards are taking place again at the Lowry Galleries, Salford Quays, Manchester on Thursday October 25, 2007. The awards have grown in size and stature each year, with increasing support from journalists, sponsors and guests alike.

Launched to recognize and reward outstanding journalism in coverage of a region and its built environment, these awards take in local, national and business press. The Awards are specifically designed to showcase the continued growth, development and regeneration of the property sector in the North West, and entries are welcome from journalists writing across the design, construction and property sectors.

As the regional built environment continues to develop, journalists play an integral role in shaping opinion, leading debate and reporting current affairs to multiple stakeholders. The North West is a vibrant region, well served by journalists who reflect its changing landscape. - Journalists may enter as many categories as they wish, although the same articles cannot be submitted for more than one category.
- · Only one entry consisting of one article is allowed per category.
- Each category entry must be accompanied by a completed entry form and comprise of eight copies of the article (ORIGINAL AND SEVEN PHOTOCOPIES) published in the twelve month to 31 August 2007. PLEASE NOTE THAT EACH COPY OF THE ARTICLE MUST HAVEA COPY OF THE ENTRY FORM AND A STATEMENT, WHERE APPLICABLE, ATTACHED. PHOTOCOPIES OF THE COMPLETED ENTRY FORM AND STATEMENT ARE ACCEPTABLE.
- If the article is not by-lined, confirmation of authorship (from the editor of the publication in which it appeared) should be attached.
- All articles in each category must relate to the construction, property and architectural industries.
- Articles published in house journals/newsletters etc are NOT eligible.

GROUP ENTRIES

For any category an article by more than one journalist from one magazine may be submitted. The article must be by-lined by two or more journalists or confirmation of authorship (from the editor) should be attached.

NEWS ARTICLE

If your entry was published as a local or national News story it can be accompanied by an explanation (*) of no more than two hundred words giving the background to the article submitted. For example, you may wish to explain that the story was an 'exclusive' or that the degree of research or teamwork required to produce the story was of particular merit.

FEATURE ARTICLE

If your entry was published as a Feature article it can be accompanied by an explanation* of no more than two hundred words outlining the relevance of the article to current issues in the construction, property or architectural industry in the geographical area.

PROPERTY SUPPLEMENT**

If your entry is an article from a property supplement, or a supplement** either as part of a national or regional newspaper or business magazine, the editor should prepare a statement clearly outlining why he/she believes the supplement has substantially covered the market sector during the period, year ending 31 August 2007 with investigative reporting, feature articles and news stories.

- ** Eight copies of the article or the supplement with a completed entry form attached to each copy must be submitted.
